Abstract:

$x(t)$ is Brownian motion in d dimensions and L_t is its occupation distribution

$$L_t(A) = \frac{1}{t} \int_0^t \chi_A(x(s)) ds$$

$F(\mu)$ is a function that is translation invariant i.e

$$F(\mu * \delta_a) = F(\mu)$$

We are interested in the behavior of

$$\frac{1}{t} \log E[\exp[tF(L_t)]]$$

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
