Coverage: We will cover most of Chapters 1-7. Details of coverage, recommended reading, and suggested problems will be distributed separately.

Homework: There will be *five* graded homework assignments worth 20 points each during the semester. Homework should be worked out independently. *Unexcused* late submissions are subject to a 20% point reduction. *Homework assignments submitted two days after the due date would not be accepted*. In addition, some reading and suggested homework problems from the text will be assigned. These problems will not be collected. However, it is essential that you work them out.

Quizzes: There will be *six* 15-minute quizzes worth 10 points each during the semester. Quiz questions will be similar to homework problems and the examples shown in class. You have the option to drop one quiz with the lowest score. The tentative quiz dates are:
